



Bottoms Up 4k

Beer Run



Spacecoast Associates for the Advancement of Zymurgy (SAAZ) – Brevard, FL

- Club members stationed at different pour stations along the run route to pour 4 oz samples for "race" competitors (21+)
 - By the end of the race, each competitor has consumed 1 beer (12oz)
- Proceeds from the run benefit St. Baldrick's Foundation, which is dedicated to fighting childhood cancer

- Alternative idea: Adventure Brewing Co (Fredericksburg, VA): 0.5k Couch Potato Run

Yeast Give-Away Live Oak Brewing Co. – Austin, TX

- Most commercial breweries re-pitch yeast in 15 18 fermentations
 - Once a yeast is no longer viable, breweries simply dump it
- Homebrewers bring pre-sanitized vessels to take home ready-to-go yeast starters for their next brew
 - CAUTION: Be careful if yeast is going in to mason jars or glass growlers. Active fermentation can cause them to explode.

Guess-the-Beer

- Easy-to-implement game for monthly club meetings
 - Guess the style: 1 point
 - Guess the ABV: 1 point
 - Guess the SRM: 1 point
 - Guess the exact beer/brewery: 3 points
- Winner gets _____ (free beer, pint glass, a puppy, etc)

Wort Share

Surly Brewing Co. - Minneapolis, MN

- Homebrewers take home 5 gallons of brewery-produced wort to ferment at home.
 - Can be designed in many ways: post-mash OR post-boil/chill
- Careful with state laws many states will only allow an event like this when the yeast is pitched once that the wort has left brewery premises

Continuously-Hopped IPA

Wynkoop Brewing Co – Denver, CO

- Club members each receive 1-2 oz of hops, with a timestamp
 - Host brewery brews a batch of IPA
- Brewery emcee calls up attendees to pitch hops every 1-2 minutes throughout the event
 - Video (skip to 2:00): Wynkoop AHA Rally

Community Hopped Beer

Hardywood Park Craft Brewery – Richmond, VA

- Hardywood Community Hopping Project: A collaboration to create an IPA with hops grown by local homebrewers
- Every spring, Hardywood gives out 1,000 hop rhizomes for interested growers to plant throughout Greater Richmond.
 - Growers harvest the hops, and bring them back to brew RVA IPA
 - Additional example: <u>Denver Beer Co Neighborhood Hop Swap</u>

Fantasy Homebrew

Draft

Fermentation Nation Podcast

- Standard homebrewing ingredients are 'drafted', and the recipe can only contain the ingredients that the brewer drafted
- Similar to fantasy football, but instead of drafting Le'Veon Bell with the first pick – you're drafting 2-Row malt (probably)

Iron Brewer

Bloatarian Brewing League-Cincinnati, OH

- Entrants specify their yeast prior to a specific date
- Malt bill and special "iron brewer" ingredient are revealed that day
- Competition entrants must use all of the ingredients specified, but can add any additional ingredients as desired

Forage for Local Ingredients

Bitter & Esters Homebrew Shop – Brooklyn, NY

- Homebrewers were led by a trained botanist through Central Park in NYC to gather potable ingredients
- Stan Hieronymus visited the shop and was presented with a series of homebrews made with local ingredients that were inspired by his book, Brewing Local

Fingerprint Brew

SPARGE Brew Club - Northampton, MA

- All club members brew the exact same recipe
- Club members taste all variations together to compare how each one tastes, while discussing the reasons for contrasting results
 - Each beer is slightly different in various ways (i.e. each beer has a different "Fingerprint" of the brewer who made it)
 - Recipe: <u>SPARGE Brew Club Fingerprint APA</u>

Club Collaboration

Cascade Brewers Society – Eugene, OR Heart of the Valley Homebrewers – Corvallis, OR Oregon Brew Crew – Portland, OR

- Each club was asked to brew 20 gallons of whatever they wanted that fit the guidelines: "dark" and "Belgian"
 - None of the clubs knew what the other 2 were going to brew
 - All 3 beers were mixed together into a single 55-gallon rye whiskey barrel from Oregon Spirit Distillers in Bend, OR
 - The final result was tapped at Homebrew Con 2018 Club Night

Advent Calendar Exchange

Plainfield Ale & Lager Enthusiasts (PALE) – Plainfield, IL

- Club members sign up to each brew four different beers with a firm deadline to have them bottled & ready to drink.
 - Bottles are delivered, and sorted into mixed cases of homebrew.
- Each person participating receives 20 different beers, and 4 of their own beers in the cases which are (in theory) enjoyed each night of December leading up to Christmas.
